SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT FOR

This is a summary of the annual report for International Association of Sheet Metal, Air, Rail and Transportation Workers (SMART) Local No. 36 Welfare Plan, EIN 43-0681778, for the year ended December 31, 2017. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefit Security Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Trustees of International Association of Sheet Metal, Air, Rail and Transportation Workers (SMART) Local No. 36 Welfare Plan have committed themselves to pay certain claims incurred under the terms of the plan.

Insurance Information

The plan has a contract with Aetna Life Insurance Company to pay life and accidental death and dismemberment and a separate contract with HCC Life Insurance Company to pay stop loss claims incurred under the terms of the plan. Additionally, the Plan has contracts with Humana to provide health benefits to Medicare eligible retirees. The total premiums paid under all policies for the policy period ending December 31, 2017 and July 31, 2017 were \$1,981,555 and \$69,627 respectively.

Basic Financial Statement

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan was \$50,107,771 as of December 31, 2017, compared to \$42,608,227 as of January 1, 2017. During the plan year, the plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$7,499,544. This increase included unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. During the plan year, the plan had total income of \$29,624,284 including (but not limited to) employer contributions of \$21,884,920, participant contributions of \$3,528,057, realized losses of \$47,850 from the sales of assets and earnings from investments of \$4,071,024.

Plan expenses were \$23,646,564. These expenses included \$1,736,443 in administrative expenses, and \$21,910,121 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries.

insurance information including sales commissions paid by insurance carriers;

financial information and information on payments to service providers;

information regarding any common or collective trusts, pooled separate accounts, master trusts or 103-12 investment entities in which the plan participates;

assets held for investment; and

transactions in excess of 5 percent of plan assets.

If you request a copy of the full annual report from the plan administrator, these two statements and accompanying notes will be included as part of that report.

You also have the legally protected right to examine the annual report at the main office of the plan at 2319 Chouteau Avenue, Suite 300, St. Louis, MO 63103 and at the U.S. Department of Labor in Washington, D.C., or to obtain a copy from the U.S. Department of Labor upon payment of copying costs.
